Is there a built-in mechanism for reevaluating the standard over time? 3. Are your EERS targets integrated into utility resource plans, and state energy demand and GHG emission forecasts? If so, what challenges have you encountered and how have you overcome them? 4. Does your state allow trading of energy savings for purposes of meeting the EERS targets? If so, are there geographic restrictions (e.g., within a utility service territory, within the state) on where the energy savings can come from? Has any trading occurred? 5. How does your state determine if the program administrators have met their EERS targets? 6. How has ARRA funding changed the landscape for energy efficiency programs in your state? Are ARRA-funded programs eligible to count towards the EERS targets? Do you envision ARRA-funded programs influencing the size of EERS targets during the next period in which the targets are under review?
